About the project

The Second Chance Theatre Project is a unique collaboration between NICRO, the University of Cape Town's Centre for Theatre, Dance and Performance Studies (CTDPS), Department of Social Development, and the Western Cape Department of Correctional Services (Pollsmoor Correctional Facility).

Through this remarkable initiative, the project partners endeavour to highlight the positive impact of theatre making in assisting offenders to rewrite their stories and turn their lives around. Guests are challenged to see offenders as more than their crime. Instead, audiences are challenged to see offenders as members of our society and to acknowledge that society has a vital role to play in the rehabilitation process.

Through this project and the 2019 production, NICRO showcases its belief that offenders have a real future beyond the prison walls, if they are afforded a helping hand and can commit to returning to their communities as contributing individuals.

The University of Cape Town's involvement in this exciting project forms part of its Community Engagement Programme, funded by the National Research Foundation (NRF). UCT's research initiative investigates the impact of the theatre on offenders from prison to parole as well as the development of resilience and responsible citizenship.

Part of this research is shaped around investigating desistance (cessation of offending or other antisocial behaviour) and the rehabilitative potential of making theatre. To this end, the research programme offers Pollsmoor Correctional Facility insiders auditions and works with approximately 25 inmates each year. The project has also developed a second theatre company for parolees, offering UCT and NICRO support to some six to ten parolees for the first two years following their release.

The parolee company makes theatre for the public and schools, works with UCT theatre students and develops relationships with community arts organisations. The parolees also participate in social reintegration programmes offered by NICRO.

Postgraduate UCT students receive NRF study bursaries for the research component of the project. University staff members are not reimbursed for their work on the project.
