Zakes Mda is a prolific writer of novels, plays, poems and articles for academic journals and newspapers and his writing and which has been translated into twenty languages. He was born in the Eastern Cape, spending his early childhood in Soweto, and finishing his school education in Lesotho.

Ways of Dying is his first novel for which he received great acclaim worldwide. Other works include The Heart of Redness, The Madonna of Excelsior, Fools, Bells and the habit of eating: Three Satires, The Whale Caller, Cion and Black Diamond, amongst others.

Mda has won numerous awards in South Africa and internationally. These include the Sunday Times Literary Prize, the Amstel Playwright of the Year Award, the Commonwealth Writers Prize for Africa, the M-Net Prize, the Zora Neale Hurston/Richard Wright Legacy Award and the American Library Association Notable Book. His novel Cion, set in southeast Ohio, was nominated for the NAACP Image Award. His memoir Sometimes there is a Void: Memoirs of an Outsider was the New York Times Notable Book for 2012. His novels have been translated into 21 languages and his The Plays of Zakes Mda has been translated into South Africa's eleven official languages.

He is a founding member and serves on the advisory board of African Writers Trust and in 2012, he was awarded an honorary doctorate by the University of Cape Town for his contribution to world literature. The South African Government conferred on him the Order of Ikhamanga, in Bronze for his excellent contribution in the field of literature that has put South African stories on the world stage.

Mda is based in Athens, Ohio, where he spends his time writing and teaching.
